REGISTRATION, FALL

Registration sessions for Fall 2004, will be from 3:00- 6:00 (except the Tuesdays in Bridgeport, 3:00-3:50).

Bridgeport: June 8, 10, and other days when Dr. Harper is not in Waterbury or Stamford.

Stamford: June 7, 16

Waterbury: June 3, 9

FALL STUDENT TEACHING

The seminar date for Fall student teachers has been changed to August 23, in order to precede the beginning of school in the districts. A notice is being mailed to this effect.

PRAXIS II

Students planning on student teaching in September should be taking the PRAXIS II on the June 12 date at the latest. If any part of the test needs to be retaken that should be taken on the September date. Contact the School of Education during the summer if that is necessary, so that you can get the exact information about the registration deadlines and test date.
