### Program requirements

- A minimum of 120 credit hours with a minimum cumulative quality point ratio of 2.00
- A minimum of 30 semester hours in one of the following areas of concentration:
  - Business Studies
  - Engineering, or computer related fields
  - Humanities
  - Natural sciences/Mathematics
  - Science
  - Social Science

### Admission requirements

- Complete the application for enrollment at [bridgeport.edu/apply](http://bridgeport.edu/apply)
- Submit transcripts
  - Submit proof of high school completion or its equivalent
  - Submit transcripts from all colleges/universities attended (*transfer applicants*)
- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- First-year students must submit a personal essay (optional if you choose to submit SAT/ACT scores)
